Head northwest from Edinburgh for a jam-packed day of extraordinary mountain ranges, lochs and Highland castles. This tour takes you through historic Stirlingshire to the famous Loch Lomond and Trossachs National Park and on to the West Highlands. Explore charming Highland villages Inveraray and Luss, travel through Campbell country to Kilchurn Castle on the shores of Loch Awe, and soak in some of the most stunning views of the Scottish Highlands along the way.

Heading through historic Stirlingshire our first stop is Doune Castle, one of Scotland's best-preserved medieval castles and filming location for *Outlander*, *Game of Thrones* and *Monty Python and the Holy Grail*.

Travelling through Campbell country, feast your eyes on Kilchurn Castle on the shores of Loch Awe.

Journey south to Loch Fyne for a lunch stop at the charming town of Inveraray. Here, you have the option to visit Inveraray Castle (open Thursday - Monday, late March - late October) or, for an adventurous twist, head to Inveraray Jail, hailed as one of the world's most well-preserved courtrooms and prisons.

After lunch, we head back east and take in the iconic beauty spot Rest and Be Thankful, which has stunning views of the Arrochar Alps. The beautiful conservation village of Luss, on the bonnie banks of Loch Lomond, is our final stop before we head back to Edinburgh, arriving in the evening.



#### DOUNE CASTLE

Known to *Outlander* fans as Castle Leoch, the seat of Clan MacKenzie, Doune Castle is one of the best-preserved medieval strongholds in Scotland. Built in the 14th century, the castle has survived through the wars and rebellions of Scotland and has its own interesting history. It also starred in *Monty Python and the Holy Grail* and more recently featured as the setting for Winterfell in the pilot episode of *Game of Thrones*.

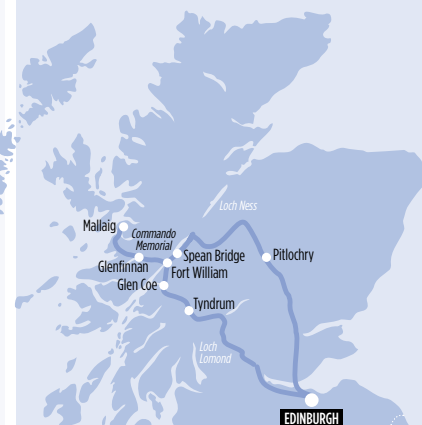
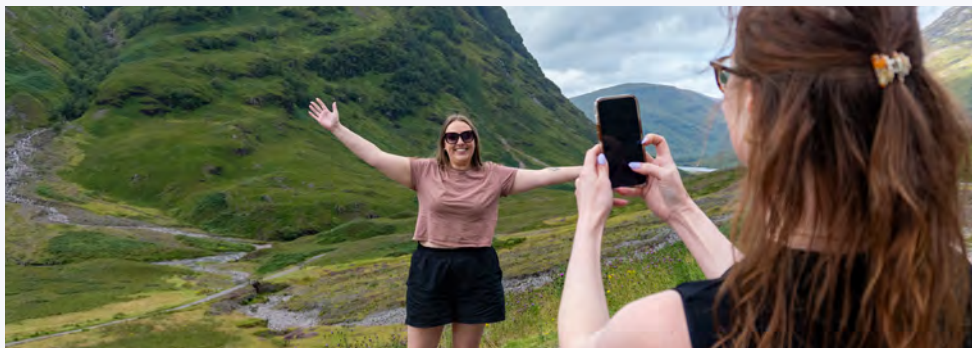

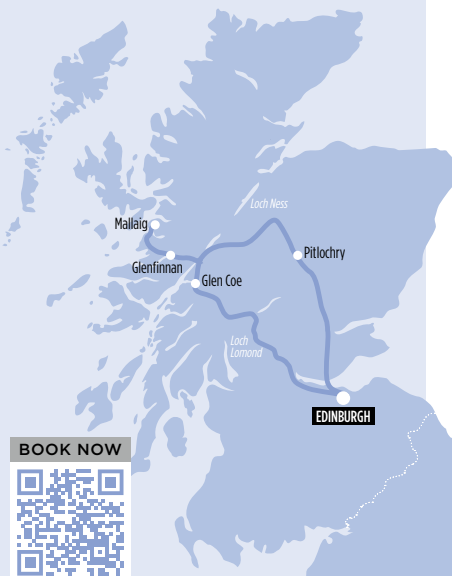

**Explore the unique character of Scotland's east coast on a journey along the Fife coast. Pass colourful fishing villages, uncover the history of St Andrews, and enjoy free time to explore its castle, cathedral, or famous golf course. Round off the day with a visit to Falkland and its royal palace.**

We start our tour in the morning with a scenic drive along the beautiful Fife coast. The journey is just as charming as the destination, with old-fashioned stone cottages, rolling coastal scenery, and picturesque villages passing by your window.

Our first stop is Anstruther, the largest fishing village on the East Neuk of Fife. Take a relaxed stroll along the harbour, once a bustling centre for herring fishing and trade. Today it's home to small boats, seagulls, and some of the best fish and chips in Scotland.

Next, we continue north to St Andrews, where you'll have free time to explore and find a spot for lunch. History fans can visit St Andrews Castle, where the ruins overlook the sea. Take a walk through the remains, peek into the eerie Bottle Dungeon – one of Britain's most notorious medieval prison cells – and follow the story of Scotland's turbulent Reformation period through the castle's audio guide. Alternatively, visit St Andrews Cathedral or head to the Old Course, the world's oldest golf course and the heart of the game's history.

On the way back to Edinburgh, we stop in Falkland, Scotland's first conservation village. Stroll past beautifully restored cottages and visit Falkland Palace, a Renaissance gem once favoured by the Scottish royals. We pass the striking Forth Bridge, an engineering icon and UNESCO World Heritage Site, before returning to Edinburgh in the early evening.

**A splendid introduction to Scotland. This tour fuses the remarkable beauty of Loch Lomond & The Trossachs National Park with the majestic sight of the Kelpies and the savage history of Stirling Castle. On this trip there is plenty of time to examine amazing architecture and ponder over breathtaking natural and man-made wonders while immersing yourself in myths, legends and stories.**

We depart Edinburgh and head west towards Falkirk where you get the chance to visit and marvel at the stunning Kelpies, the world's largest equine sculptures. Dedicated to the horse-powered heritage of Central Scotland, the Kelpies also celebrate the mythological transforming beasts living in our lochs, rivers and streams. Our journey then takes us to the 'Bonnie

Banks of Loch Lomond' where we take time at Balmaha to admire views of Ben Lomond. Here, you will have the opportunity to go on a woodland walk that will afford you great views of the loch. Standing on its bank you will understand why Loch Lomond has been immortalised in a world-famous song.

The rest of the afternoon is spent exploring Stirling. You will have the option to discover the impressive Stirling Castle, one of Scotland's most important structures both historically and architecturally. Many royals have been crowned at Stirling Castle, including Mary Queen of Scots, and it was central to William Wallace's fight in the Wars of Independence. Alternatively, explore Stirling, geographically one of the most significant towns in Scottish history. We return to Edinburgh in the early evening.

Imagine walking in the footsteps of Jamie and Claire from *Outlander*, with a local guide regaling all the gruesome history and stories which inspired Diana Gabaldon. We take you on a journey to some of the most famous locations from the hit TV series, such as Midhope Castle, the real-life Lallybroch, Doune Castle, the seat of Clan MacKenzie, and the impressive Blackness Castle, the setting for Fort William. Your guide will give you an insight into the history and stories of each location, making this the perfect trip for those looking for a quick *Outlander* fix.

We leave the capital and head to Midhope Castle - the real-life Lallybroch and home of

Jamie Fraser. We then visit Doune Castle, one of Scotland's best preserved medieval castles and used as the setting for Castle Leoch in *Outlander*.

We then have lunch in Culross, the fictional village of 'Cranesmuir' where Claire was accused of witchcraft. This charming village is the most complete example of a 17th and 18th century burgh in Scotland today.

Next is the village of Falkland, used for filming 1940's Inverness. Our final stop is the impressive Blackness Castle, featured as Fort William in the series, arriving back in Edinburgh early evening.

We drive through Scotland's scenic landscapes, venturing further into the Highlands before stopping at one of Scotland's famous whisky distilleries. Alternatively, head out to explore the charming market town of Crieff with its delightful local shops and cosy cafés.

After passing through the stunning Sma' Glen, a valley of ancient myths in the Scottish Lowlands, we explore The Hermitage forest in the heart of Perthshire to take a leisurely woodland walk amid captivating rivers and waterfalls.

Our return journey visits the charming village of Dunkeld and its cathedral before returning to Edinburgh, passing the iconic Forth Bridges on the way.

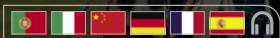

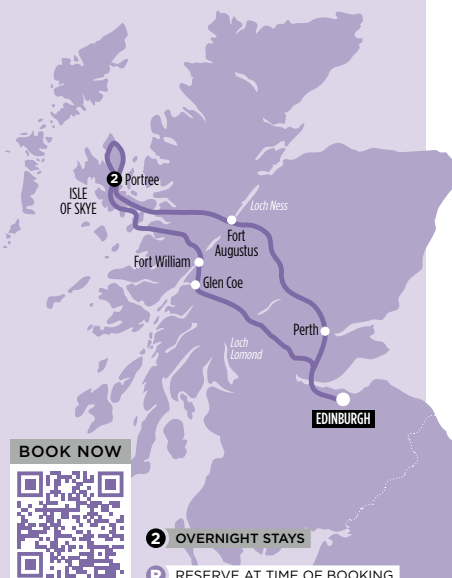

Over three days, you'll travel through some of the country's most postcard-worthy landscapes while your local guide brings Scotland's tales, music, and turbulent history to life. Keep an eye out for the shy water creature Nessie as you make your way to the iconic Isle of Skye, where you'll spend two nights in the colourful town of Portree. The trip also includes a train ride on the West Highland Line, following the world-famous route of the Hogwarts Express from the Harry Potter films.

**DAY ONE |** We leave Edinburgh and pass the UNESCO World Heritage Site Forth Bridge on our way north. The first stop of the day is Dunkeld, where you can wander through its peaceful streets and quaint corners.

We venture deeper into Highland territory to the Commando Memorial. On a clear day, you'll be treated to sweeping views of Ben Nevis, the UK's highest peak. From there, we head to the legendary Loch Ness to stretch your legs at Fort Augustus village and enjoy lunch.

Next, we make our way to Dunvegan Castle, the historic seat of the MacLeod clan. While entry is optional, history lovers will feel immersed into centuries of Highland history as they wander through the castle's rooms and gardens. The evening is free to explore Portree and its harbour.

(Overnight: Portree)

**DAY THREE |** We rise early, catching the first light over the Highlands as we take the ferry to Mallaig and board the train\* along the famous West Highland Line, following the route made iconic by the Hogwarts Express in the Harry Potter films.

After arriving in Fort William, we travel on through Glen Coe, pausing to take in photos of its dramatic peaks and valleys. A comfort stop in Tyndrum give you a chance to grab a light snack before arriving back in Edinburgh in the early evening.

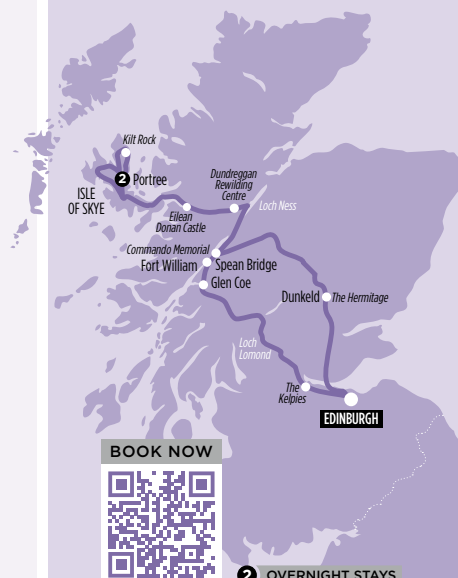

This journey is designed to give you the best of both worlds, with a night by Loch Ness and a night on the Isle of Skye. It means you can experience both locations properly, with time to enjoy each setting. Along the way, you'll travel through standout Highland scenery, including Glen Coe, the Fairy Pools, and Eilean Donan Castle, with plenty of chances to get out and explore.

**DAY ONE |** Leaving the city behind, you'll head to the pretty village of Dunkeld, where there's time to stretch your legs along banks of the River Tay. Continuing on, we go on a gentle woodland walk through the Hermitage to a beautiful waterfall crashing through a narrow gorge. You'll then travel on to Pitlochry for lunch and a wander.

In the afternoon, the scenery becomes more rugged as you make your way north to Clava Cairns, a well-preserved prehistoric burial site surrounded by standing stones. Next up is Culloden Battlefield, where your guide will walk you through the events of the 1746 Jacobite Rising.

Arriving at Loch Ness, you'll have the chance to take an evening cruise on the loch – a relaxed way to end the day as the light fades over the Highlands. (Overnight: Fort Augustus)

**DAY TWO |** Your day begins with a scenic journey towards Skye and a stop at a viewpoint overlooking Eilean Donan Castle, set where three sea lochs meet. Crossing the Skye Bridge, you'll pass beneath the peaks of the Cuillin Mountains before heading out on foot to the Fairy Pools. This walk follows a rough path alongside bright, clear pools and small waterfalls.

Next, you'll head to the island's colourful harbour town, Portree, where there's time to grab lunch and explore at your own pace. Later, you'll visit the striking rock formation of the Old Man of Storr, rising above the surrounding cliffs, followed by a stop at Kilt Rock, where basalt columns drop sharply into the sea below. 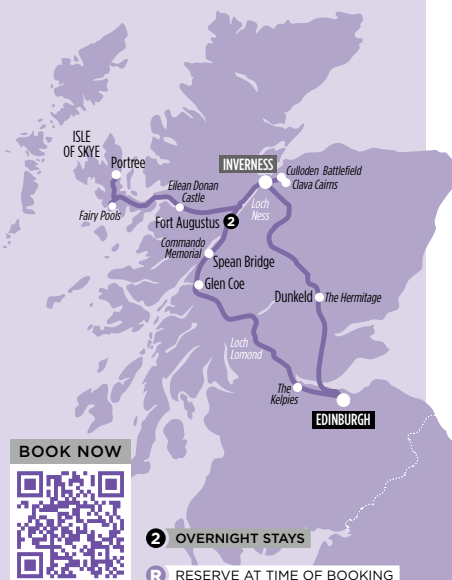

After a fabulous three-day Isle of Skye tour, we arrive back to Edinburgh in the early evening.

**DAY ONE** | Leaving Edinburgh, we journey west past the ancient city of Stirling towards the scenic beauty of Loch Lomond. Take photos from the Rest and Be Thankful viewpoint and enjoy free time in pretty Inveraray for lunch. Visit the ancient Dunadd Fort before continuing towards the bustling port town of Oban for our ferry to Mull, where we spend two nights in Tobermory. (Overnight: Tobermory)

**DAY TWO** | After breakfast, we set off on a wildlife boat tour to the Treshnish Isles and Staffa. Enjoy breathtaking sea views while looking out for seabirds and, depending on the season, even seals, dolphins, eagles, and whales. As we sail to Staffa, hear stories of giants and geology and get up close to the striking Fingal's Cave. Once we land on Staffa, we have ample time to explore the island and observe the enchanting little puffins\* in their natural habitat. (Overnight: Tobermory)

**DAY THREE** | Today we travel across mountainous Mull to visit the spiritual Isle of Iona, often referred to as the sacred heart of Scotland. Afterwards, we catch the ferry back to Oban, where you can try fresh seafood and have a drink in a local pub on our last night. (Overnight: Oban)
